The only one off grant received in this year was £1700 as match funding from Gloucestershire County Council towards the purchase of a Speed Indicator device. In this year our we had increased income from allotment rents of £170 over the previous year. We also had income of £704 from rental of the Changing Facility which was £0 in 2018/19.
